#### **2017 must never** be repeated,

the losses was devastating:-

- Over 9,053 fires
- 1,381,405 acres (5,590.35 km2) destroyed
- 1 firefighter, 45 civilians fatalities
- Over 230,000 people evacuated

- Over 9,800 structures and houses destroyed
- Containment and suppression costs exceeds \$3 Billion
- Total economic loss well above \$13 Billion
- Hundreds of houses and infrastructure lost due to wildfires and follow-on mudslides.
- Major personal losses

#### 1 Background / introduction

Over the last twenty years the fire seasons have become longer, the wildfires ferocity has increased and containment and suppression costs have skyrocketed, including property losses and human lives lost.

All this at a very high business, economic cost, personal costs and major adverse health impacts on First Responders.

Wildfire containment cost now consumes nearly 50% of the total USA forestry budget.

Undermining forestry development and adding substantially to climate change.

Wildfires today are a global international challenge.

Existing equipment and methods, such as used in 2017 fire season, have been developed over many years of practical experience. These methods were substantially enhanced with the introduction of air tankers.

It is however our belief that new <u>innovations</u> can be developed to substantially reduce the impact of wildfires & mudslides and ensure that the objectives of the initiative can be achieved.

The overall goal of "Headon" are to reduce wildfire destruction & the follow on mudslides by over 60 to 80%.

#### 2 "Head-on"

- 1) "Head-on" is a multinational initiative launched by The Firefly Innovations.
- 2) It is an <u>innovation competition</u> initiative to encourage and promote innovations & the development of new methods and equipment:-
- To <u>stop</u> and <u>reduce the wildfire</u> <u>destruction</u>, including <u>follow-on</u> <u>mudslides</u> and the annual number of wildfires.

#### 3 Objectives and goals

1) To stop and reduce the destruction of wildfires and follow on mudslides risks and destruction up to 80%. The 2018 goal is a 40% reduction, based on 2017 as baseline.



- In this a person has to take into account that wildfires are a natural phenomena and that a substantial percentage of wildfires are ignited by natural factors such as lightning and other natural factors.
- Also policies such as "Let Burn" that is used to balance losses and costs.

## However the ferocity and destruction of wildfires can be reduced.

- To achieve significant cost reductions and improve efficiency (Productivity) with wildfire containment and suppression operations.
- 3. To create safer and protected communities and habitat.
- Redirect forestry funding currently used for containment and suppression back for forestry management.

#### 4 How?

#### 1) The key is innovation

#### "Innovation"

Through the innovative development of new equipment, methods and management in support of fire services.

 From land-use, town-planning, property protection, fire detection, re-action, containment & suppression, victims support and rehabilitation and landslide prevention actions.

### 2) And <u>collaboration</u> & <u>partnerships</u> <u>across all role-players.</u>

 Communities + Fire services + Business + Government

This includes industry associations, local government through to Federal government.

Via innovation focus groups with Fire-stations as the center.

<u>Covering</u> from land-use, town-planning, property protection, fire detection, re-action, containment & suppression, victims support and rehabilitation and landslide prevention actions.

#### 3) The main elements & focus are:-

3.1) To establish at "Fire-stations"

### "First Responder Innovation Hubs";

Hubs that bring the fire services, communities, business, government and industry organizations together as innovation focus groups.

3.2) The initiative also introduces a role for a volunteer:-

#### "Community Fire Captain".

To act as coordinator between the fire services and the communities;- and

To provide a coherent joint approach between the communities and fire-services for the implementation of the <u>regional wildfire</u> <u>prevention zones</u> if not already in place.

3.4) To develop <u>new wildfire containment</u> methods, options and equipment.

#### 5 Always keep in mind

Furthermore a person needs to keep in mind that:-

Each and every wildfire can only effectively be reduced and stop through a combination of:-

- Land use, property planning and prevention options that are applied
- o Experienced fire services, that are;-

A number of equipment options & methods have already been identified that could have a substantial impact.

 Equipped and empowered to handle and deal with a magnitude of wildfires.

<u>A combination</u>:- it should also be kept in mind that containing and suppressing wildfires require a combination of options, from ground level first responders, equipment, fire-engines through to air-tankers.

And that in this, the key to success is the reality that; All new equipment development, methods and options require the input, knowledge and experience of the existing fire services.

For this reason emphasis is placed on existing fire services:-

#### 6 Existing fire services;-

Head-on believes that any new innovations of equipment and methods have to form an integrated part of the existing fire services. As well as, draw on the support and experience of existing fire services.

#### The initiative is therefore designed:-

To draw on the experience of existing fire services, with the focus points

- 1. Fire-stations and
- 2. Community Wildfire prevention organizations on an individual chapter or council basis.
- Secondly to assist Fire-stations to develop an innovation culture and the skill of existing fire services to maximize the impact of wildfire containment actions.






 In addition, to encourage participation, innovation, partnerships & collaboration with communities, business, government and industry associations, an objective that is included in the design.

3) Via innovation focus groups with Firestations as the center.

**Covering** from land-use, town-planning, property protection, fire detection, re-action, containment & suppression, victims support, land rehabilitation and landslide prevention actions.



# 9 Funding deployment & reporting

The primary objective and goal of Head-on is to initiate innovative new methods and equipment to:-

 Manage, contain and suppress wildfires and the follow-on damage of mudslides.

Utilizing California 2017 as base year in scale, with the primary goal to reduce future wildfire impact to 80% of the 2017 California baseline.

Parallel with this, the goal is to develop an innovative culture among first responders and communities to maximize secure, safe communities, and safe & stable business environments with regards to wildfires and mudslides.

- All funding will go directly to and will be applied to achieve the primary objectives.
- Full public reporting form an integral part of the initiative.
